

## Veterans Democratic Club of Sacramento County

Rick Guerrero, seconded by Andres Ramos, nominated Lawson Stuart for Interim President. The motion was adopted unanimously by voice vote.

Reginald Bronner moved, and Cierra Craney seconded, to postpone election of Vice President. The motion was adopted unanimously by voice vote.

Andres Ramos moved, and Terry Schanz seconded, to direct Interim President to charter the Club with the Democratic Party of Sacramento County. The motion was adopted unanimously by voice vote.

Terry Schanz moved, and Reginald Bronner seconded, to allow the Interim President to choose next meeting date. The motion was adopted unanimously by voice vote.

Reginald Bronner moved, and Liz Fehr seconded, to adjourn. The motion was adopted unanimously by voice vote.
